L: As He called Abraham to leave the land where he lived and the people with whom he lived, God promised Abraham, "All the peoples of the earth will be blessed through you."

C: **Tonight, we and all peoples of the earth are blessed, just as He promised.**

L: Through the prophet Isaiah God promised, "A virgin will conceive and bear a son, and shall call his name Immanuel – God with us."

C: **Tonight, we celebrate, for to us a child is born, to us a son is given!**

L: And his name is called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace.

C: **Yes, tonight we celebrate because the Child of the manger is Jesus, our God come to save.**

L: Almighty God, You made this holy night to shine with the brightness of the true Light. Help us on this night to truly celebrate His coming to save us and guide us to walk in the light of Jesus' presence all our days, until we wake to the brightness of His glory in eternity; through your only Son, Jesus Christ, our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

The Birth of Jesus Foretold – to Mary

L: Centuries ago there was a young maid named Mary living in the small town of Nazareth. She was engaged to a man named Joseph. One day an angel named Gabriel came to Mary and said:

C: "Greetings, O favored one, the Lord is with you!"

L: Mary was greatly troubled by the angel, and tried to discern what sort of greeting this might be, so the angel said to her:

C: "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God. And behold, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus. He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High."

L: This troubled Mary. She felt as though it would upset all her plans – and disappoint all of her family and friends. So she said to the angel:

C: "How will this be, since I am a virgin?"

L: The angel said to her, "The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you. The holy one to be born will be called the Son of God." And then, the angel gave her a sign to help her to adjust to God's plan:

C: "And behold, your relative Elizabeth in her old age has also conceived a son, and this is the sixth month with her who was called barren. For nothing is impossible with God."

L: As Mary then prepared to go visit Elizabeth and see with her own eyes what God was doing, she said:

C: "I am the Lord's servant. May it be done to me according to your word."

The Birth of Jesus Foretold – to Joseph

L: Joseph was the name of the man who was engaged to Mary. When he discovered that, before they came together, Mary was expecting a baby, Joseph was greatly disturbed.

C: However, being a just man and unwilling to put her to shame, he resolved to divorce her quietly.

L: But as he considered these things, behold, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream, saying:

C: “Joseph, son of David, do not fear to take Mary as your wife, for that which is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. She will bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins.”

L: When Joseph woke from sleep, he did as the angel of the Lord commanded him: he took his wife but knew her not until she had given birth to a son.

C: And tonight, we celebrate that God did send His Son – Jesus – to the earth to save us, just as he promised.

The Birth of Jesus

Luke 2:1-7

In those days Cesar Augustus issued a decree that a census should be taken of the entire Roman world. (This was the first census that took place while Quirinius was governor of Syria.) And everyone went to his own town to register.

So Joseph also went up from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to Bethlehem the town of David, because he belonged to the house and line of David. He went there to register with Mary, who was pledged to be married to him and was expecting a child. While they were there, the time came for the baby to be born, and she gave birth to her firstborn, a son. She wrapped him in cloths and placed him in a manger, because there was no room for them in the inn.

The Visit of the Magi

Matthew 2:1-12

After Jesus was born in Bethlehem in Judea, during the time of King Herod, Magi from the east came to Jerusalem and asked, "Where is the one who has been born king of the Jews? We saw his star in the east and have come to worship him."

When King Herod heard this he was disturbed, and all Jerusalem with him. When he had called together all the people's chief priests and teachers of the law, he asked them where the Christ was to be born. "In Bethlehem in Judea," they replied, "for this is what the prophet has written:

"But you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; for out of you will come a ruler who will be the shepherd of my people Israel."

Our Response to the Good News

Confession of Faith

(Luther's explanation to 2nd Article)

- L: With Mary and Joseph, shepherds and magi, and the entire church throughout the ages, we confess our faith in the child of the manger:
- C: I believe that Jesus Christ, true God, begotten of the Father from eternity, and also true man, born of the virgin Mary, is my Lord, who has redeemed me, a lost and condemned person, purchased and won me from all sins, from death, and from the power of the devil; not with gold or silver, but with his holy, precious blood and with his innocent suffering and death, that I may be his own and live under him in his kingdom and serve him in everlasting righteousness, innocence, and blessedness, just as he is risen from the dead, lives and reigns to all eternity. This is most certainly true.**

The Christmas Prayer

- L: Heavenly Father, we rejoice this night that you keep your promises and that you have provided your own dear Son, who has opened the door to paradise through his birth, death and resurrection from the dead.
- C: We rejoice that your Son, who became like us, now is changing us to be more like him.**
- L: We rejoice that nothing can separate us from your love – not sickness, death, anything!
- C: We pray that you would come to those who need to know your closeness and your healing presence.**
- L: O holy Child of Bethlehem, reveal yourself to them, we pray.
- C: Cast out our fear and empower us to share your love with all.**
- L: O Christ, our Head, strengthen your body, the Church, so that with our lives rooted in you, we may draw the attention of the world away from the many calamities, fears, and follies that distract and deceive, and toward you and your promises.
- C: Amen.**

God’s love was revealed among us in this way: God sent his one and only Son into the world so that we might live through him. Love consists in this: not that we loved God, but that he loved us and sent his Son to be the atoning sacrifice for our sins. Dear friends, if God loved us in this way, we also must love one another. No one has ever seen God. If we love one another, God remains in us and his love is made complete in us.

The Word Became Flesh

John 1:1-5, 12-14

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was with God in the beginning. Through him all things were made; without him nothing was made that has been made. In him was life, and that life was the light of men. The light shines in the darkness, but the darkness has not understood it.

Yet to all who received him, to those who believed in his name, he gave the right to become children of God - children born not of natural descent, nor of human decision or a husband's will, but born of God. The Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us. We have seen his glory, the glory of the One and Only, who came from the Father, full of grace and truth.

L: In the Child of the manger we find life, and that life is the light of the world.

C: **Tonight we celebrate his birth.**

L: He has made us to be the light of the world.

C: **Tonight we celebrate that he has come to save us.**

L: Open the eyes of our hearts, Lord Jesus

C: **That by faith we may see you.**

L: Knowing that You are among us, give us the courage and commitment we need to go into your world and be among the hurting, the forgotten, the lonely and the dying.

C: **Let the light of this night radiate through us into the lives of the people we meet daily. Use us to share your light with them.**

L: To You, O Lord, we commend all who are in any need, all who struggle through his night in which we take such delight, all who live in loneliness or fear, and all who have not acknowledged You as Savior and King as we pray as You have taught us:

C: **Our Father who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom and the power and the glory forever and ever. Amen**
