The Ascension of our Lord

The Scripture Reading Acts 1:3-11

After Jesus' death, he presented himself alive to his disciples in many different settings over a period of forty days. In face-to-face meetings, he talked to them about things concerning the kingdom of God. As they met and ate meals together, he told them that they were on no account to leave Jerusalem but "must wait for what the Father promised: the promise you heard from me. John baptized in water; you will be baptized in the Holy Spirit. And soon." When they were together for the last time they asked, "Master, are you going to restore the kingdom to Israel now? Is this the time?" He told them, "You don't get to know the time. Timing is the Father's business. What you'll get is the Holy Spirit. And when the Holy Spirit comes on you, you will be able to be my witnesses in Jerusalem, all over Judea and Samaria, even to the ends of the world." These were his last words. As they watched, he was taken up and disappeared in a cloud. They stood there, staring into the empty sky. Suddenly two men appeared—in white robes! They said, "You Galileans!—why do you just stand here looking up at an empty sky? This very Jesus who was taken up from among you to heaven will come as certainly—and mysteriously—as he left."

A Reading from the Revelation of John

TUESDAY, MAY 24 WAS OUR VOTERS' ASSEMBLY

The meeting, had four primary business items on the agenda:

Election of Officers – Ballot was approved Approval the 2022-2023 Operating Budget

2022-2023 Theme: The MISSION OF GOD through STL – past, present, and future

Introduction of the Pastoral Transition Plan

<u>Proposed Budget</u>: The General Operating Fund for July 1, 2022 – June 30, 2023 was presented and approved included: a) balanced income/expense projection of \$472,440.0, which is an increase of about 3.8% over the current budget; b) an increase in the salary base from \$26,750.00 to \$27,550.00; c) continuing our commitment of \$3,000.00 per year to the District; d) No funding from the STL Foundation – though we do anticipate looking to the Foundation for capital improvements; e) continued mission envelope offerings to MCREST (July – September), Camp Restore Detroit (October – December), St. Luke Project (January – March), and Abigayle Ministries (April – June).

<u>Pastor Hetzner's Retirement</u>: On Sunday, April 24, Pastor Hetzner announced to the congregation that he will be retiring in February 2023. He and the Board of Elders have been working on the details with Dr. Rob Kasper from the District Office and the plan was presented at the Voters' Assembly.

Our Confession of Faith
